Fencing

A reminder that once you've purchased your block, ownership passes to you and it is no longer the responsibility of the developer. To ensure your block is protected and to reduce dumping on your site, we recommend installing fencing around your block ASAP. If you need assistance finding a fencing provider, please don't hesitate to contact myself or the sales team.

Verges

In the ACT the verge is the responsibility of the residents. This includes not only grass but also where there are planted areas. You can find out more about this on the Access Canberra website. We encourage you to maintain your verge to keep Strathnairn beautiful!

Conservation Corridor

A sneak-peak into our first walking track

Exciting times ahead with our first, brand-new walking track finally opening to the public! The track links the Shepherds Lookout track and The Link Building in Strathnairn. It's a relaxing walk that boasts stunning views of the corridor and Brindabellas while taking you on a journey through a wide range of ecosystems.

We are so excited for you to enjoy this section of the Conservation Corridor. You will soon understand why we think it is such a special area!

Whether you're a plant-enthusiast, birdwatcher or just looking to get outdoors for some exercise, this track has something for everyone.

The track takes you through beautiful Callitris woodlands, where the rare Callitris mistletoe can be found, for those with keen eyes. You'll also venture through grassy, rocky, Pink-tailed Worm-lizard habitat and a dam with lots of birdlife, including (the very cute) Australasian grebes.

There are a few diversions to the track, allowing for a more intimate view of the river and breath-taking landscapes. In the right conditions, you can even hear the calming sound of the Murrumbidgee River.

Along the track and its diversions, you'll find an old, beautiful scribbly gum and a huge range of wild flowers. You might even spot some orchids!

You can also expect to see some birds of prey flying overhead and wallaroos and wallabies enjoying the sun in grassy patches.

Interpretative signage and more information will be installed within the next few months.
